A fantastic end to 2015, as 146 returned from the annual Merseyside Field Training Day as overall winners!



Field Training Day sees 30 Squadrons meet and demonstrate their skill in a number of areas. These include, foot and banner drill, marching band, first aid, aircraft recognition, marksmanship, to name but a few.

146 did well in many individual areas, winning the marching band and aircraft recognition competition, coming second in full bore marksmanship and third in foot drill uniform inspection, banner drill (jointly placed) and the flight sim competition.

The cadets have also been working on a "project" competition, which for 2015 was to create a recruitment video for the Squadron. The many many hours of work put in by the team paid off and the video won first place.

Special awards included work in the local community, in which 146 not only won out of the 30 Merseyside Squadrons, but also took the Charles Whitcomb trophy presented to the winning Squadron from the 159 in the Wales and West area!

All of this (and much more not mentioned), led to the Squadron being announced as overall winners, with the band, aircraft recognition and flight sim teams, also representing Merseyside Wing at the Region Training Day, at RAF Cosford.

Cadets from the Squadron were also presented with individual awards. Flt Sgt Harvey-Kelly won the best sportswoman's trophy, an award she has won for a record breaking four years in a row!

Flt Sgt Mackintosh also won best overall female cadet in Merseyside Wing! An incredible achievement, awarded following an extensive selection process, including written application and interview panel, not to mention all of her hard work leading up to the initial nomination.

The Squadron will now go forward as the Merseyside representative for the Lee's Trophy, awarded annually to the best Squadron in the Air Cadet Organisation! Lots of hard work ahead for the Squadron!
