### The Gazette

We very much regret to inform you that we shall be forced to put up the price of the Gazette to 3d. per copy.

### **Amateur Boxing**

Officers and N.C.O.s in charge of cadet amateur boxers are requested to take notice that under no circumstances should a cadet be allowed to box in a competition or at a tournament unless it is promoted under the rules of the Amateur Boxing Association, the affiliated County Associations, or Imperial Services Boxing Association. Such tournaments are promoted under the auspices of Affiliated Clubs, Units of the Army, Navy and R.A.F. Territorials, and organisations of schools, Scouts, Church Lads' Brigade, Federation of Boys' and Working Men's Institutes.

Boxing at an unregistered or unauthorised tournament will incur suspension by the A.B.A. The close season of amateur boxing 18 April 30th-October 1st.

### Gliding Wings

Officers and cadets who obtain gliding certificates "A," "B" or "C" will be entitled to wear special "gliding wings" which have been approved by this headquarters.

In addition officers or cadets who have completed a gliding course and are well reported on by their instructors, but have

not actually qualified for one of the above certificates, will be issued with a special certificate by this Committee which will entitle them to wear a "half wing."

No officer or cadet may wear a gliding wing unless it is supported by actual possession of a certificate issued and signed by the British Gliding Association or this headquarters.

Wings are to be worn over the left breast pocket with the lower edge of the wing touching the top of the pocket flap or medal ribbons if worn.

Gliding wings should be worn in preference to officers' proficiency wings, but not to "A" Licence wings.

"A," "B" and "C" wings are priced at 1s. 6d., and the half wing at 1s. 3d.

Squadrons should arrange to order all the wings required by their squadron on one order and not allow each individual to place his own order. Orders should state the types of wings required, i.e. "A," "B," "C" or half-

### MATTERS OF INTEREST

### By Air Commodore J. A. Chamier

(No. I was the Inception of the Corps; No. II was correspondence regarding Finance. Both of these were printed in No. 1 Air Defence Cadet Corps Ganetic, June, 1939. The series continues.)

### ON RAISING MORE SQUADRONS

At the end of the first article we left the position as having 102 squadrons at the end of March, 1939. By mid-June, when I write, we have 150—eighteen having been formed in June alone. But that is not the whole tally. The various area organisers throughout the country have sent in their reports on the number of additional squadrons now engaged in forming in their areas—and these total at least 130. We can safely say that we have in sight and likely to be formed in the near future 280 squadrons.

When we went to the Air Ministry with our plans in the spring of 1938 we promised to do our best to raise 200 squadrons before the end of March, 1940—the close of the Air Ministry financial year—and at that time it looked a formidable undertaking. In our hearts we doubted if we should reach that number so quickly, and the Air Ministry was equally doubtful. However, the figure of 200 squadrons was agreed as a sort of upper limit for no better reason than that we thought it our limit.

Already it is clear that the limit must be exceeded. It would be impossible for us at this stage to go to any committee which had started to work for a squadron and tell them that it was too late and that they must give up the idea—nor would we wish to do anything so dampening to local enthusiasm. It is certain, therefore, that the limit must be raised with no assent of the Air Ministry, but discussions must take some time. The response to the call for cadets has been so overwhelming that

the whole question of the attitude of the State to such Cadet Corps may require revision, and negotiations for increased recognition are actively proceeding.

The case, therefore, for more squadrons in general in parts of the country where there are none at present is very strong: there are in addition certain of the larger towns favourably situated with regard to Royal Air Force help where a start has been made with one squadron, but where it is clear that there is ample support for more, and where it is in the best interests of the Corps that more should be raised. Such squadrons will be registered as soon as it is clear that the local committee can arrange for their maintenance and welfare.

London presents a peculiar problem of its own, as is natural from its great size and wealth. Of all the areas in England, London was the quickest to start to raise squadrons, and borough after borough rapidly followed suit. In some cases, when local committees found how many boys wished to join, they asked permission to raise a second squadron, and in the early days, when we had few squadrons, such requests were, under due safeguards, readily agreed to.

With our greater experience to-day, we would be inclined to say that we made a mistake in that respect for two reasons. There are a limited number of R.A.F. stations around London, and therefore there is a natural limit to the number of London cadet squadrons who can have convenient affiliations. The later cadet squadrons have had in some cases to go further than is desirable to find their foster-parents. Where affilia-

tions are not close and convenient the cadets are deprived of some of the facilities which can be of the greatest benefit to them, and which they most value.

The second reason is that we none of us know enough about the future. A committee may estimate for a year's expenditure, but its estimates may not allow enough for such things as technical equipment, work benches, materials, or summer camps: it is a matter of precaution, therefore, to live as far as possible well within our income, and try to establish reserve funds for future needs.

Moreover, no one can tell to what extent local support can be relied upon for the maintenance of the local cadets. We are all entitled to hope, and to believe, that a scheme of such obvious benefit to the boys themselves will never be allowed to succumb for want of a small amount of support from local residents, but it may easily prove to be the case that when the days of crisis pass the enthusiasm which provides funds for these cadets may cool a little. It would be a great pity if an area which could support one well-equipped and efficient squadron found it difficult to provide funds for two squadrons, and then only on a lower scale of efficiency. These considerations weigh heavily on the Headquarters Committee, and they have decided that for the present it is not possible to approve of the "doubling" of any more London boroughs' squadrons.

I have deliberately written "for the present": we must have time to catch our breath, to ascertain what further support we can get from the Air

Ministry, and to learn whether there is to be a limit on our numbers.

It must not be assumed that the Central Committee is unsympathetic to the desire of squadrons to multiply themselves: it is clear that for purposes of inspection and training as well as in the interests of economy such a procedure may well be the best that could be adopted, but in view of the number of London squadrons already formed, when the time is right for consideration of the question the procedure must be applied systematically and with caution.

When the composition and organisation of the Corps are more clearly outlined, announcement will be made that the Central Committee will be prepared to consider applications from those committees who wish to raise a further squadron of cadets in their district. A proper examination can then be held, progress made can be assessed, facilities for training inspected, financial condition checked, and a fair decision arrived at as to which squadrons ought to be doubled and which had better concentrate on the welfare of their single squadron.

In the light of these remarks it is hoped, therefore, that local London committees will not put further pressure on Headquarters to sanction an increase in their cadet squadrons. If they would care to put on record the fact that they would like to be put on a list for consideration at the appropriate time, such application will be in every way welcome.

The motto of the Corps is "Venture Adventure," but we must not embark too light-heartedly on the treacherous sea of finance: we must be sure that our barque is in all respects well provided.

# NEWS FROM THE SQUADRONS

The amount of news published of each squadron depends on two things—the space available and the news received. Squadrons are particularly requested to send in reports as often as interesting news is available. Photographs cannot at present be used in the GAZETTE, but they are nevertheless welcome, as they can be used in AIR REVIEW and other journals.

There will not be room in the Gasstta for reports from all the squadrons each month, so preference will be given to reports which are brief and contain news of general interest.

### Glasgow and District Report

#### WING INSPECTION

The Lord Provost of Glasgow was to have officially opened the Glasgow Wing Headquarters on April 29th, but unforeseen circumstances prevented him doing so.

On Saturday, April 29th, the Wing Headquarters was officially opened by Baillie Ian Galbraith, deputising for the Lord Provost. The ceremony was attended by all the important sponsors of flights, and by various important people, at 2.30 p.m. Refreshments were served, following which the party proceeded to the works of Messrs. G. and J. Weir, where the Glasgow Wing were on parade (Nos. 32F, 62, 67 and 83 Squadrons). Baillie Galbraith inspected each squadron and complimented the cadets on their neat and disciplined appearance.

### EMPIRE AIR DAY

The entire Glasgow Wing, four squadrons, with two squadrons from Greenock, paraded at Abbotsinch R.A.F. Station on Empire Air Day. Cadets were allocated duties as follows: programmes, stewards to car parks, runners, programmes, boundaries etc.

patrolling boundaries, etc.

At 3.55 p.m., headed by the pipe band of No. 602 Squadron, the Glasgow Wing marched on to their "markers" on the aerodrome in front of a gathering of 15.000 people. Here they were inspected by Group Captain J. H. O. Jones, Officer Commanding the Station. Following the inspection the cadets again took up their various aerodrome duties.

Six cadets of No. 67 Squadron flew from Renfrew Airport to Abbotsinch—this being the first time any cadet in the Glasgow Wing had been air-borne (Scottish Airways, Ltd., were the sponsors of this flight).

### CIVIL AVIATION

Scottish Airways, Ltd., have sponsored a flight in No. 67 Squadron—commanded by S/L. Parrott—and intend to absorb the best cadets from this flight into their establishment as the cadets come to the necessary age. Cadet Forrester commences this week as apprentice ground engineer.

The Scottish Flying Club have sponsored a flight in No. 32 Squadron—commanded by S/L. Tulloch—and intend to facilitate these cadets in flying training.

Messrs. Drysdales, boiler manufacturers, of Yoker, Glasgow, have also sponsored a flight in No. 83 Squadron—commanded by S/L. H. Rudd—for their apprentices.

Messrs. Mavor and Coulson, of Bridgeton, Glasgow, intend to sponsor one and possibly two flights in No. 122 Squadron—no commanding officer as yet—for their works apprentices.

### 12th (Walthamstow) Squadron

This squadron has been making considerable progress. It has been at full cadet strength for three months, and there is a large waiting list. Advantage has been taken of the fine weather to instruct cadets in drill on a fine open parade ground lent us by Father O'Grady, of St. George's Church, E.17. Drill has greatly benefited the cadets, who have been congratulated on their smart and orderly conduct by several serving officers of various services who have had the opportunity of seeing them.

Twenty cadets were on special duty at the Royal Air Force Station, North Weald, on May 17th and on Empire Air Day. The cadets were responsible for programme selling, for which they created a fair record by selling a programme for every third person attending North Weald on May 17th, and selling every programme available on Empire Air Day. The whole squadron has been invited to a close inspection of the station and aircraft at North Weald on Sunday, 11th June, and are to be the guests of the commanding officer to tea in the canteen.

Every cadet has been given a passenger flight at Maylands Aerodrome, Romford, through the personal generosity of Mr. R. Gordon, president of the Romford Flying Club. This has been much appreciated by all ranks, and there is great keenness amongst the cadets to be selected for further flights which have been promised.

Cadet-Squadron-Leader K. Garston-Jones, Officer Commanding 6th (Romford) Squadron, who piloted the majority of the cadets of this squadron on their passenger flights, inspected this squadron on our first ceremonial parade on 13th May. We were glad of the opportunity of welcoming the officer commanding our neighbourly and very friendly squadron.

A swimming challenge from this squadron has been accepted by the 6th (Romford) Squadron, and will be swum shortly.

The officers of this Squadron have collected a private fund to equip a band—drums have been ordered from the best makers, with the squadron crest emblazoned on each, and preliminary practices have commenced under a qualified instructor. Lack of space at headquarters prevents us inaugurating the lectures and demonstrations which we should like to have, and from taking full advantage of the material at our disposal and the keenness of the cadets.

# No. 87 (Collyer's School) Squadron, Horsham

We have been most generously treated by No. 4 (A.C.) Squadron, R.A.F. Station, Odiham, to which we are affiliated. An officer of that

squadron pays us regular visits for instruction, and a party of senior cadets has been invited to spend a day at Odiham in July. On June 9th three service machines were flown from Odiham to Gatwick to stage a demonstration of army co-operation work for our benefit.

We are also indebted to the authorities at Gatwick both for use of their serodrome on that ocasion and for instruction which they have given our cadets on other occasions.

Practical work in signalling, navigation, firstaid, fire drill and model-making is conducted by officers of the squadron, and cadets are now to play a part in local A.R.P. exercises.

### No. 78 (Wembley Borough) Squadron

With the approval of Group Captain Orlebar, the chaplain of Northolt and Ruislip—Rev. S/L. F. W. E. Wagner, M.A., Sc.D.—arranged a Church of England parade service on Sunday, June 11th, at Northolt Aerodrome, and at his invitation officers and cadets of the above squadron attended.

The preacher at the service was Rev. Air Commodore Walkey, M.A., C.B.E., Chaplain-in-Chief of the R.A.F., and in his address he heartily welcomed the cadets, pointing out that it was the first occasion on which he had had an opportunty of addressing A.D.C. cadets. The Chaplain-in-Chief was greatly interested in the Corps, and after the parade insisted on shaking hands with each cadet present, and giving them a friendly talk. He was impressed by their smartness and high standard, and expressed the hope that he would like to arrange in the autumn a church parade in London for A.D.C.C. squadrons in the metropolis.

### Nos. 66 and 97 (Croydon), Squadrons

Few of the public functions of this borough pass without the Air Cadets or their officers taking part, the largest, so far, being that of the recent Nation Service parade. The lads stood up to this well for five or more hours, during which time they only marched six miles. On this occasion the parade marshal, Lieut. A. D. C. Brownlow, of the Grenadier Guards, commented upon the cadets' smartness.

During Empire Air Day at Kenley, twenty-five cadets from the 66th squadron were detailed to help officials at the aerodrome. Both squadrons are far advanced in drill and engines. Their standard of knowledge of aircraft has been greatly increased by the fact that two officers hold important positions at Croydon Airport, and the cadets are allowed to visit the airport at almost any time. The Surrey Flying Services have proved of great assistance by giving a complete aircraft to No. 66 Squadron as a training machine.

A cadet has commenced training in a power-driven aircraft and is proving satisfactory. The squadrons have their own headquarters, and the Croydon regiment of the R.E.s have loaned them their Drill Hall. Officers of the cadets have been made honorary members of the R.E.s officers' mess.

No. 66 has a full complement of instructors, while No. 97 is well on the way to completion. The Bishop of Croydon, the Rt. Rev. W. L. Anderson, has consented to become chaplain of both the Croydon squadrons, and many eminent local people are on the committee.

### No. 103 (Doncaster) Squadron

Through the generosity of the Town Council we have the free use of a large and comfortable room in Belle Vue House for headquarters and officers' mess, and of a large school building for general use.

Lectures are given in the classrooms, a very wide and smooth playground is excellent for drill and parades, while grass lawns are at our disposal for P.T. So that, although this squadron has been registered only two months, its accommodation problems are solved.

We are particularly fortunate in that we are less than half a mile from the busy Doncaster Airport, where the authorities and the C.A.G. are very interested in our activities.

In addition, we have been granted permission by the Earl of Lincoln, O.C. 616 Squadron, A.A.F., to which we are affiliated, to use their convenient parade ground, drill hall and other facilities.

At the Empire Air Day display the cadets took part in the march past, and afterwards gave noble service in helping to control the 30,000 crowd and in guarding the 'planes.

Then, through the kindness of the O.C., Group Captain Hunter, our cadets have been to the great R.A.F. Station at Finningley, only six miles away, where they received a generous welcome. Half a dozen R.A.F. officers showed them over the whole place, and the O.C. made the evening particularly pleasant by his friendly helpfulness.

Our C.O. and flight officers are ex-R.A.F. or ex-R.N.A.S. pilots, and one of them has been able to delight the squadron by giving flights to the cadets in his own 'plane.

Ten of our cadets are attending a gliding course, and before long we hope to take a very active part in local civic ceremonies, church parades, etc. We are also looking forward to visiting the Leeds Tattoo in July. In fact, we are almost too busy to realise that we are only a two-months-old baby!

### **NEW ORDERS**

### Saluting

Officers and cadets, when passing uncased colours, will salute the colours and the officer in command.

### Geards of Honour

A guard of honour, not exceeding 100 cadets with a flight lieutenant in command, two junior officers and a proportion of N.C.O.s, will attend upon the King and members of the British Royal Family.

A guard of honour not exceeding 50 cadets with two officers will attend to receive an air or other officer commanding carrying out an official inspection.

### Promulgation of Orders

A C.O. will ensure that all orders affecting officers and cadets of his squadron are given such publicity as will enable them to study and become acquainted with their contents.

### Uniform—Officers

Dress regulations for officers have not, unfortunately, been very clear, and the following details supersede any previous instructions.

The Air Ministry will not permit of officers holding cadet commissions wearing unaltered R.A.F. uniform on cadet parades.

There is only one correct uniform for all officers of the Air Defence Cadet Corps.

Uniforms should be of R.A.F. type cloth and cut. Chromium Cadet Corps buttons will be worn with an additional three small buttons on each sleeve.

The buckle on the belt will be of chromium.

A chromium letter "C" is worn on each lapel of the jacket.

R.A.F. pattern "streamline" cap with Cadet Corps badge.

Badges of rank are worn on shoulder straps and correspond to those on the R.A.F. greatcoat except that they will be of silver braid. The width of the braid, as in the R.A.F., is

Thin stripe (pilot officer and central stripe of squadron leader) 1 inch.

Medium stripe (flying officer, flight lieutenant and outside stripes of squadron leader) 9/16 inch.

Any medal ribbons and R.F.C., R.A.F., "A" Licence, Gliding or Proficiency Wings should be worn. Only one form of wing can, of course, be worn, and it is suggested that the order of preference should be as stated: the last two might be reversed, but gliding is the official aerial activity of the Corps, and is, therefore, put before the Proficiency Wing. Officers may, however, please themselves which wing they wear if they are entitled to more than one.

### Correspondence with Air Ministry

Cases have occurred of cadet units writing

direct to the Air Ministry.

It is pointed out that the only proper channel of communication is through these headquarters, and on on account should the Air Ministry be approached direct.

In the event of the Air Ministry writing to a cadet unit it may, of course, be answered direct, but no matter other than that referred to in the Air Ministry's letter should be touched upon.

### Medical Examinations

We are asked from time to time what standard of medical fitness is expected of boys who wish to enrol in the Corps.

Most squadrons have an honorary medical officer, and it is hoped that all will attempt

to obtain one.

It is not desired to lay down anything hard and fast, but, as recent returns have shown, a large proportion of boys in the Corps hope to become members of some branch of the Royal Air Force.

Air Ministry Pamphlets 15 and 54 (Conditions of Entry for Apprentices and Boy Entrants) have been sent to all squadrons, and each of these contain an appendix showing the medical standard required for entry into the Service.

An examination of each boy on these lines would be rather too much to ask, but if medical officers would bear in mind that we aim at a high standard of fitness and hope that after a year or two in the Corps a boy would be of the standard required by the Service, they should be able to carry out a modified examination using the A.M. pamphlet as a guide.

It is not intended that boys should necessarily be turned down because they do not appear likely ever to reach this standard even after the benefit they should gain from being in the Corps, but in many cases there are such a large number of applicants for so few vacancies in a squadron that squadron commanders may be glad of a legitimate reason for refusing to add further names to their waiting list, and they might do this by tightening up the medical standard required of new applicants.

It may seem bad luck on boys with defective eyesight, flat feet and other minor constitutional ailments, but if we aspire to being a fruitful source of first-class recruits for the Services, and the Royal Air Force in particular, we must be fairly hard-hearted.

The Committee take a very high view of the necessity of physical fitness in the cadets. and with the large choice of recruits in most districts it is hoped that squadrons will pay particular attention to this when enrolling new members.
